

Introduction

Our firm, Centerline Wealth Advisors, LLC, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services, including Wealth Management, Retirement Plan Consulting, and Financial Planning & Consulting to clients. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, objectives, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least quarterly, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs and goals. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually discuss your portfolio.

We manage accounts on a discretionary basis. After you sign an agreement with our firm, we're allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments.

Our firm has a minimum requirement of \$750,000 in investable assets for opening and maintaining accounts or otherwise engaging us. We reserve the right to waive this asset minimum at our discretion.

Financial Planning & Consulting is included in our Wealth Management service for no additional fee. Financial Planning & Consulting is also offered as a separate service for a flat or hourly fee. We do not monitor your investments for the Financial Planning & Consulting service.

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing annual fee, billed quarterly based on the value of the assets in your account. Our Wealth Management fee schedule ranges from 0.50% to 2.00% depending on the value of the assets in your account. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. While your asset based fee may be reduced as you add assets to your account, the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our revenue. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, we will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

Our maximum fee is 1.00% for our Retirement Plan Consulting service. We charge an upfront retainer when you sign an agreement for this service.

Our maximum flat fee is \$25,000 for our Financial Planning & Consulting service. We charge an upfront retainer when you sign an agreement for this service.

The broker-dealer that holds your assets either charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you, or charges an asset based pricing fee to cover these transactions. The broker-dealer's transaction fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Wealth Management service.

You may also pay charges imposed by the broker-dealer holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

Representatives of our firm are also registered representatives of PKS, member FINRA/SIPC. When executing transactions in this capacity, they receive normal and customary commissions. A conflict of interest exists as these commissionable securities sales create an incentive to recommend products based on the compensation earned. To mitigate this potential conflict, our firm will act in the client's best interest.

Representatives of our firm are also insurance agents. They offer insurance products and receive customary fees as a result of insurance sales. A conflict of interest exists as these insurance sales create an incentive to recommend products based on the compensation adviser and/or our supervised persons may earn. To mitigate this potential conflict, our firm will act in the client's best interest.
